

Smart meters are now being installed in our area.

Here's what you can do to refuse installation.

Put up a "No Smart Meter" notice

Immediately put up a "No Smart Meter" notice on the wall next to your electric meter, that says "The ratepayer at this property DOES NOT CONSENT to the installation of a Smart Meter on this property"

Install A "No Smart Meter" Physical Preventive.

installing a special metal ring around their existing meter so that the meter cannot be removed unless someone physically breaks a small lock. Some people are installing locked wooden boxes around their existing meters with a mesh front or hole for the meter's face that allows the utility company to read, and upon request, service the existing meter, but inhibit the installation of a Smart Meter. If an installer breaks your box or lock, it's trespassing, and they're damaging your property.

Some are photographing their meters with the sign and restraint in place as proof of refusal. If the installer proceeds against your wishes and damages your property, you will have something to use in small claims court, or for any future class action suit that may arise.

Send a Notice to PG&E

Immediately send a Notice to PG&E, certified mail with a return receipt, instructing them not to install a Smart Meter on your property.

Keep a copy of the letter that you send, and attach the signed return receipt to your copy. That will be your evidence that the utility company received your Notice.
